

Walking Tour: Literary **Footsteps**



6 Leaving the cafe, you're almost at the Spanish Steps, which Dickens described in his Pictures from Italy. Byron stayed at 25 Piazza di Spagna in 1817.



4 Cobbled Via Margutta is where Truman Capote wrote his short story Lola. Fellini, Picasso, Stravinsky and Puccini all lived here at some point.
