
#### Why Go?

There's something undeniably artistic in the way the landscape unfolds in the California desert. Weathered volcanic peaks stand sentinel over singing sand dunes and mountains shimmering in hues from mustard yellow to vibrant pink. **Dec-Apr** Moderate temperatures lure in 'snowbirds' and LA weekend trippers.

May-mid-Jun, mid-Sep-Nov Crowds thin out as temperatures arc during shoulder season. Jun-Sep Some inns and restaurants close in summer's heat; many of the rest offer great deals.



## Palm Springs & the Deserts Highlights

- 1 Ascend through five zones in less than 15 minutes aboard the Palm Springs Aerial Tramway (p339).
- 2 Stretch out next to a kidneyshaped pool in a mid-century modern hotel in **Palm Springs**.
- 3 Walk in the footsteps of presidents and royalty at **Sunnylands Estate** (p347).
- Traverse to the lowest point in the Western Hemisphere in **Death Valley National Park** (p369)
- 5 Navigate smooth boulders in the Hidden Valley (p351) at Joshua Tree National Park.
- **6** Scramble around the wind caves of vast **Anza-Borrego Desert State Park** (p358).
- 7 Hide out at Hole-in-the-Wall (p368) in the forgotten Mojave National Preserve.
- 3 Lose yourself (but hopefully not your money) on the Las Vegas Strip (p380).
- Prevel in the mythology of the Mother Road at the California Route 66 Museum (p365) in Victorville.
