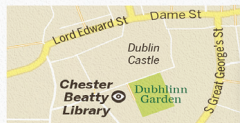
The lovely **Science** (Pearse St; 8am-5pm Tue-Fri, noon-6pm Sat & Sun) is accessible from the rear exit of the college.

The **Beatty** library, in the grounds of Dublin Castle, houses the collection of mining engineer Sir Alfred Chester Beatty (1875-1968). The breathtaking collection includes more than 20,000 manuscripts, rare books, miniature paintings, clay tablets and costumes. The fabulous **Silk Road Café** (11am-4pm Mon-Fri, closed Mon Nov-Feb) offers Middle Eastern cuisine on the ground floor of the library.

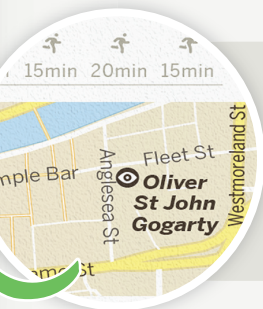
