conficent dence of land and sea, the long sampled beach of Copacabana extends for some 4km, with a flurry of activity along its length: over-amped soccer players singing their team's anthem; cariocas and tourists lining up for caipirinhas at kiosks; favela kids showing off their soccer skills; and beach vendors shouting out their wares among the tanned beach bodies. From here to your evening destination

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Seen from the peak of Pão de Açúcar, Rio is undoubtedly a Cidade Maravilhosa (Marvelous City). There are many good times to make the ascent, but sunset on a clear day is the most rewarding. Two cable cars connect to the summit, 396m above Rio. At the top, the city unfolds beneath you, with Corcovado mountain and Cristo Redentor (Christ the Redeemer) off to the west, and Copacabana Beach to the south. You'll find a cafe, restaurant and icecream shop within the park and even a snack bar (8am-9pm) at the summit.

Rio's temple to football One of Rio's most identifiable landmarks, the magnificent 38m-high Christ the Redeemer looms large atop his lofty perch (710m-high Corcovado). The statue has stunning views over Rio, which probably explains his contented expression. The traditional way to reach the top is via a steep cog train, which ascends through tropical forest and adds a touch of excitement to the experience. (www. corcovado.com.br; cog station, Cosme Velho 513; adult/child R\$68/44; 8am-7pm; 🔲 180, 583)

★ Top tip Arrive early to beat the crowds.

From here to your afternoon destination

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Actually a saltwater lagoon, rather than a lake, this picturesque body of water plays a key role in the city's psyche. *Cariocas* make ample use of the watery expanse by jogging and cycling the 7km lakeside path, dining near the water's edge or simply admiring the view. To join them, hire a bicycle on the west side of the lake or hire a swan-shaped pedal-boat from the eastern shore. In December Lagoa is home to a massive floating Christmas tree; its glittering lights are pure magic for kids and adults alike. (MCantagalo)



Dine in the open air at one of a dozen or so lakeside kiosks serving sushi, bistro fare, Brazilian and Middle Eastern dishes.



From here to your evening destination

Maracanã is hallowed ground for football lovers. It has been the site of both triumph (Pele's 1000th goal) and catastrophe (losing to Uruguay in the 1950 World Cup). Games here are spectacular, with samba drums, waving flags and tens of thousands of cheering fans sending up an earth-shaking roar when the home team (and Rio has four of them) scores. Whether or not you're a football fan, don't pass up the chance to see a game inside this historic arena. (www.maracana.com; Av Maracanã, São Cristóvão; admission R\$40-80; Maracanã)
