#### FREE STUFF

Stroll around Merdeka Square, the place where Malaysian independence was declared, and admire the colonial architecture. Spend the afternoon viewing the latest exhibition of Malaysian art at ILHAM. Once the sun has gone down, join the crowds in KLCC Park to watch the Petronas Towers light up and catch the Lake Symphony fountains play.

#### **FAMILY ACTIVITIES**

Visit the **7** Tun Abdul Razak Heritage
Park, which is home to a bird park,
a planetarium and a butterfly park.
Kids will also enjoy traversing canopy
walkways through the jungle at **7** KL
Forest Eco Park. There are plenty of dishes
to try at the evening hawker market, **2** Jalan Alor, from the adventurous to the
more familiar.
