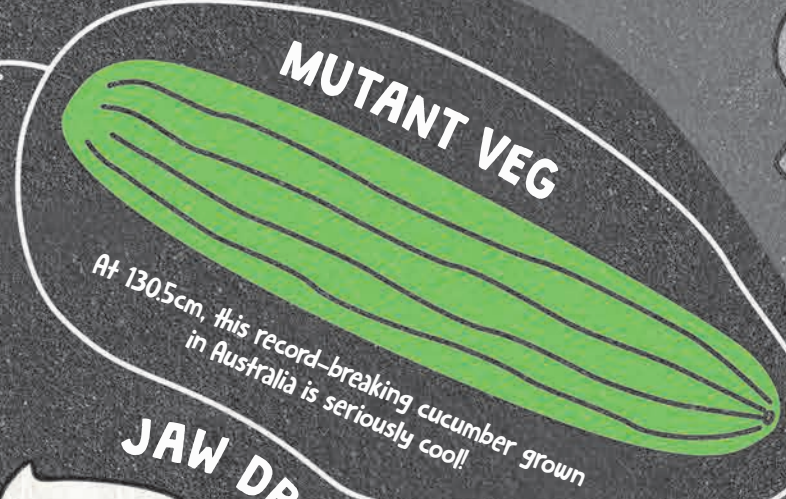
WHAT A WAIST

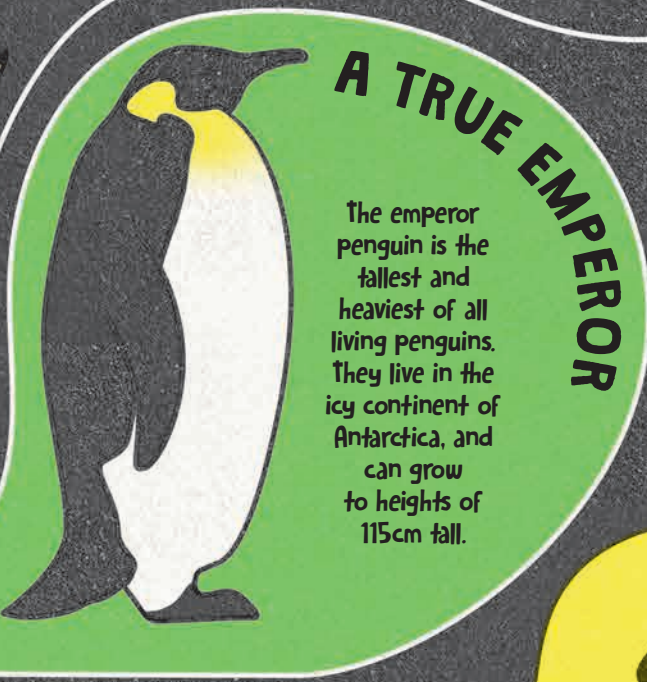
MUTANT VEG

The world's biggest flower – the rafflesia – is around 100cm wide – is also one of the pongiest. Its aroma of rotting flesh is seriously stomach churning.

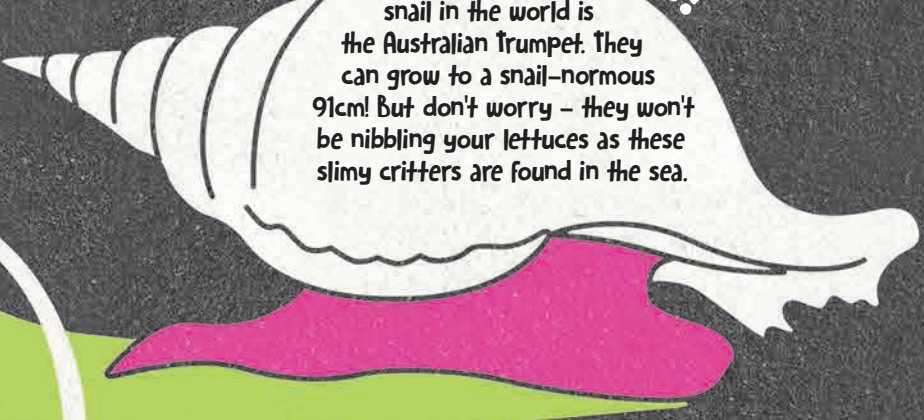
OH DEER!
