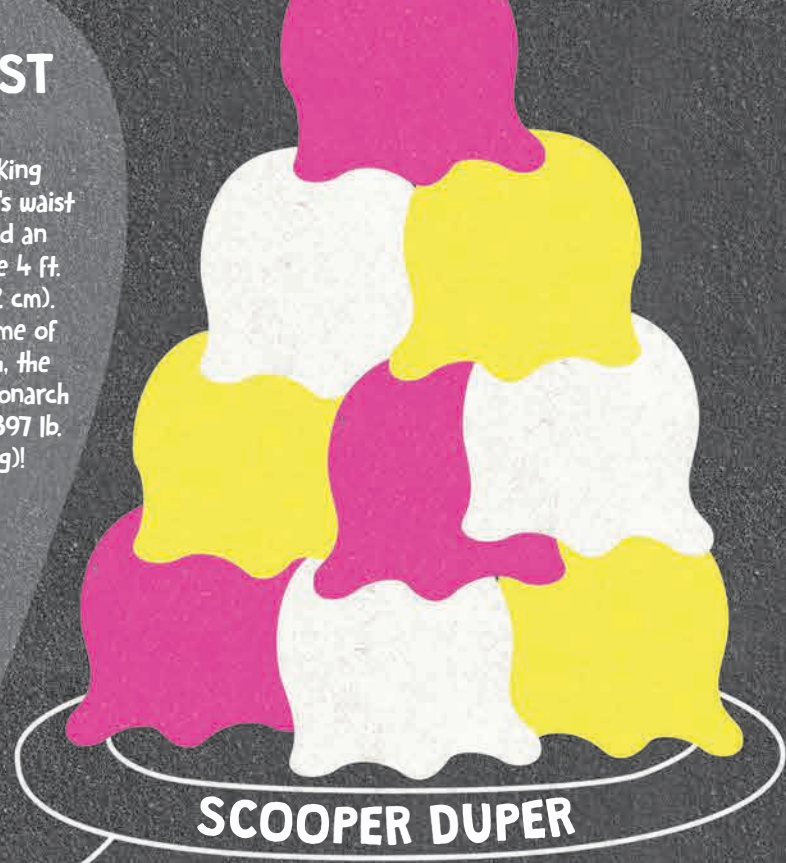

Meet Darius. He's the biggest rabbit in the world. He can stretch out to an unbelievable 4 ft. 4 in. (132 cm) long!

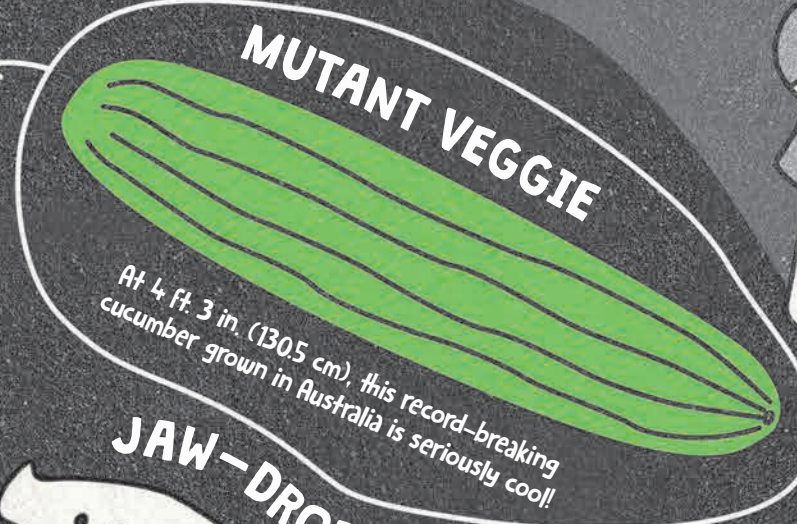
WHAT A WAIST

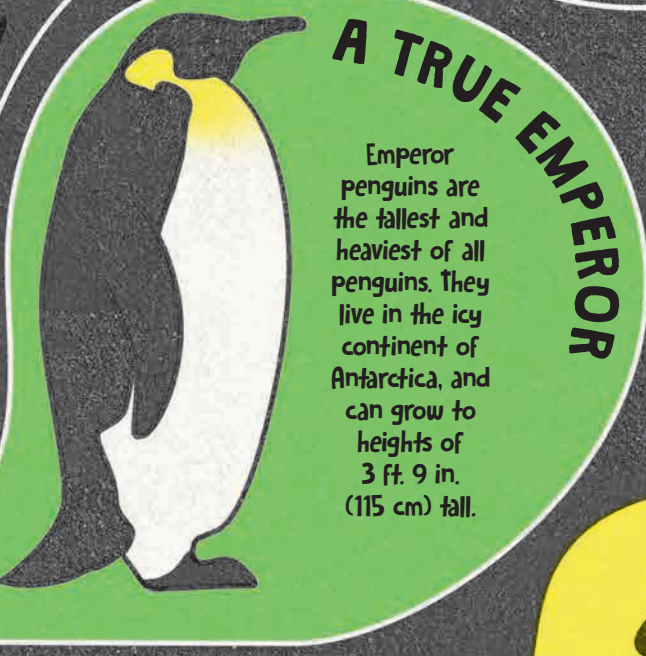
MUTANT VEGGIE
