Welcome to Vancouver

First-time Vancouver visitors are easy to spot. They're the ones suddenly stopping on the sidewalks after glimpsing the nearby snow-capped peaks framed by downtown's shiny glass towers. But there's more than scenic selfies to Western Canada's biggest city. Walkable neighborhoods, drink-and-dine delights and memorable cultural and outdoor activities make it easy to fall for this lotusland metropolis.

Vancouver Top Sights

Stanley Park (p24)

Canada's largest urban park offers dramatic forest and mountain-framed seawall vistas plus a 400-hectare woodland studded with trails, attractions and sunset-hugging beaches. Watch for raccoons, beavers and a multitude of chittering bird life.





Vancouver Art Gallery (p28)

The region's most important gallery, the VAG is a vital part of Vancouver's richly diverse cultural scene. Contemporary exhibitions – often showcasing renowned photoconceptualists – jostle for chin-stroking attention with blockbuster visiting shows.



Vancouver Police Museum (p46)

A hidden gem exposing the seedy underbelly of Vancouver's not-toodistant past. Located in a heritage building that formerly housed a coroner's court and autopsy room. Check your nervous disposition at the entrance.



Dr Sun Yat-Sen Classical Chinese Garden & Park (p48)

This delightful oasis is one of Vancouver's most tranquil ornamental green spaces. Framed by tile-topped walls surrounding a mirrorcalm pond, its covered walkways provide sightriggering respite from clamorous Chinatown.
