

Gold Souq (p24)

For a shot of Arabian Nights flair, plunge into this charmingly chaotic warren of souqs shaded by a wooden lattice roof and teeming with dazzling jewellery and gems.

Burj Al Arab (p70)

This landmark luxe hotel, with its dramatic design that mimics the sail of a ship, floats on its own man-made island and has become the iconic symbol of Dubai's boom years.

Dubai Museum (p40)

Housed in Al Fahidi Fort, the city's oldest surviving structure, this museum provides an excellent survey of Dubai's turbo evolution from desert settlement to 21stcentury powerhouse.





Al Fahidi Historic District (p42)

Exploring this restored heritage area in Bur Dubai provides a tangible sense of historic Arabian architecture and culture. Some of the traditional buildings house museums, craft shops, galleries, guesthouses and cafes.
