# Abu Dhabi Top Sights


#### Sheikh Zayed Grand Mosque (p90)

One of Arabia's most magnificent mosques and a symbol of welcome to the city, it's open to non-Muslims.

#### **Abu Dhabi Corniche** (p24)

Reclaimed from the sea, planted with scented trees and made accessible through walking and cycling paths, the Corniche and its public beaches are the jewel in the crown of this green capital.

#### Manarat Al Saadivat (p76)

Few modern cities can match the cultural ambitions of Abu Dhabi. which claims the only branch of the Louvre outside France. This exhibition explores the planned cultural district and the inspiration behind the award-winning architecture



#### Yas Marina Circuit (p104)

Home of the Abu Dhabi Grand Prix, set beside the spectacular Yas Vicerov hotel and marina, the circuit offers year-round activities. The ride at nearby Ferrari World gives the Formula One cars a run for their money.



#### Abu Dhabi Falcon Hospital (p118)

Falcons occupy a special place in the heart of Emiratis, as witnessed in the waiting rooms of this specialist clinic. Tours help visitors understand the close bond between bird and owner

#### Arabian Saluki Centre (p120)

Shaggy-eared or smoothtailed, fast-paced salukis have been the Bedouin's best friends for centuries. This breeding and training centre allows visitors to come nose to nose with the affectionate hounds and their puppies.



# Sowwah Square (p64)

With some of the most exciting buildings in the newest part of town, this square is the focus of developments on Al Maryah Island. The Galleria adds glamour to the city's new business district.



#### Masdar City (p106)

Built as an experimental project to explore environmentally sustainable urbanisation, Masdar City is powered by solar energy and encompasses a host of other green features. A self-guided tour leads around the key sights.



### Insider tips to help you find the real city

There's pleasure in rooting out the city's heritage, browsing old souqs and exploring mangrove forests. Overlook Abu Dhabi's modern core, however, and you'll miss the point. The city has embraced the 21st century and invites visitors to do the same.
