

DR SUN YAT-SEN CLASSICAL CHINESE **GARDEN & PARK**

CAPILANO SUSPENSION BRIDGE

One of the world's longest (140m) and highest (70m) suspension bridges sways gently over the roiling Capilano Canyon. (2604-985-7474; www.capbridge.com; 3735 Capilano Rd; **2**36)

AOUARIUM

Vancouver Aquarium is home to 9000 water-loving critters including sharks, wolf eels and a somewhat shy octopus. There is also

a small, walk-through rainforest of birds, turtles and a statue-still sloth.

SCIENCE WORLD

GROUSE MOUNTAIN
