# Why Go?



# Dodoma



Mar-May Heavy rains bring green landscapes, lower prices, top-notch birding and muddy roads. Jun-Aug The weather is cool and dry throughout, and wildlife watching is at its prime.

Sep-Oct The weather continues dry, and wildlife watching remains good, without the crowds.

# DAR ES SALAAM

Dar es Salaam is Tanzania's major city and its capital in everything but name. Yet, despite its size, 'Dar' is a down-to-earth place, with a picturesque seaport, an intriguing mix of African, Arabic and Indian influences, and enough historic buildings, shops and restaurants to keep you busy for several days.

# Sights & Activities

### **National Museum**

(2022-2117508; Shaaban Robert St; adult/student Tsh6500/2600; ⊕9.30am-6pm) Dar's premier museum houses the famous fossil discoveries from Olduvai Gorge (only a copy is available for general viewing) and displays on the precolonial and colonial periods.

# **Village Museum**

(2022-270 0437; cnr New Bagamoyo Rd & Makaburi St; adult/student Tsh6500/2600; 9.30am-6pm) The centrepiece of this openair museum is a collection of authentically constructed dwellings illustrating traditional life in various parts of Tanzania. Traditional music and dance performances are held some afternoons. It's 10km north of the city centre; catch a Mwenge dalla-dalla (minibus) from New Posta transport stand (Tsh300, 45 minutes).
