

Why Go?

It's but a slim wedge of North Africa's vast expanse, but Tunisia has enough history, cultural diversity and extremes of landscape to fill a country many times its size. With a sandfringed, jasmine-scented coast, it's a destination usually equated with Mediterranean sun holidays. - 4 Sip mint tea in the cool of an enchanting palmeraie in **Tozeur** (p182), a bustling southern oasis.
- 5 Slow down and experience traditional Tunisian life in **Le Kef** (p173), against a spectacular natural backdrop.
