
Why Go?

Namibia possesses some of the most stunning landscapes in Africa, and a trip through the country is one of the great road adventures. When to Go

Windhoek



Jun-Oct

Accommodation at a premium.
Temperatures soar by September.

May & Nov

Cheaper accommodation. Heavy rains sometimes occur in November; May is mild.

Dec-Apr

Rains begin in December. Humidity and high temperatures can make days unpleasant.

Namibia Highlights

1 Etosha National Park (p870) Crouching by a water hole in one of the world's premier wildlife venues.

2 Sossusvlei (p883) Watching the sun rise from the top of the fiery coloured dunes.

3 Fish River Canyon (p885) Hiking through one of Africa's greatest natural wonders.

4 Skeleton Coast (p878) Getting off the beaten track (and the tarred road) in the true African wilderness.

(5) Waterberg Plateau (p869) Hiking to the top for breathtaking views, while keeping an eye out for rare sable and roan antelope.

6 Swakopmund (p878) Getting your adrenaline fix at Namibia's extremesport capital.

7 Damaraland (p874) Tracking rhinos and desert elephants in a stunning landscape of red-bouldered mountains.
