Why Go?



When to Go


Harare



Apr-Oct Best time seasonally, with sunny days and cold, clear nights.

Nov-Apr The rainy season is beautiful, with generally sporadic rain and dramatic afternoon electrical storms.

Jul-Sep Peak season brings prime wildlife viewing, optimal white-water rafting and canoeing the Zambezi.

- unguided safaris among big cats and elephants.
- 4 Harare (p1007) Unwinding in garden restaurants within converted colonial homes.
- 5 Eastern Highlands (p1015) Breathing in lush pine forests and mountain air.
- 6 Hwange (p1022) Feeling humbled at Zim's largest

national park, home to Africa's biggest elephant population.

- 7 Matobo National Park (p1021) Tracking rhinos and seeing ancient rock art and superb scenery.
- **8 Bulawayo** (p1018) Soaking up the wonderful architecture, art galleries and history.
