## Why Go?



## San Diego




Jun-Aug High season; temperatures and hotel rates are highest, watch out for cloudy skies in June. Sep-Oct, Mar-May Shoulder seasons; moderate rates, warm with blue skies. Nov-Feb Low season but far from cold, and your chance to spot whales off the coastline.

## CENTRAL & COASTAL SAN DIEGO
