

Sprawling across the sandy plains east of Table Mountain, the Cape Flats seldom get good press, stricken as they are with crime, poverty and disease. The down-at-heel coloured communities and informal settlements (ie shacks) of the largely black townships would seem unlikely candidates as tourist destinations. However, a visit here might end up providing your fondest memories of Cape Town.

Langa, founded in 1927, is the oldest planned township in South Africa and has areas of affluence as well as poverty - a pattern repeated in the other main townships of Gugulethu and Khayelitsha (the largest with an estimated population of over 1.5 million). It's not all onenote misery. The infrastructure in the townships has improved since 1994, with the rows of concrete Reconstruction and Development Programme (RDP) houses being the most visible examples. We highlight some of the sights and projects you might like to arrange to visit on your own or on a township tour. While most of the places we list here will be safe for you to visit on your own, be sure to call your destination first and get clear directions or arrange for a local to meet you - a wrong turn in the townships can have dire consequences.

The lush garden suburb of Pinelands lies cheek by jowl with Langa; come here to visit the Oude Molen Eco Village. North of the city centre alongside Table Bay there's Bloubergstrand, a beach with a grand view of Table Mountain, and Milnerton, best visited for its weekend flea market and the gigantic Canal Walk shopping centre at Century City. Give yourself a day to see the sights in the townships and another day for the northern suburbs.

#### **Local Life**

- → Markets Join the antique, bargain and curio hunters at the weekend Milnerton Flea Market (p149)
- **Pubs** Enjoy a beer and a slice of pizza on the grass in front of Blue Peter (p147), a Bloubergstrand institution.

# **Getting There & Away**

- Car Take the N2 to Langa, Gugulethu and Khayelitsha, the N1 to Century City, and Marine Drive (R27) to Milnerton and Bloubergstrand.
- **Tour bus** The best way to see the townships. There are set itineraries but tour guides can be flexible in where they go, depending on the wishes of the group.
- **Bus** MyCiTi buses run through Milnerton to Table Bay.
- → **Train** Metro trains run to Langa, Gugulethu (closest stop Nyanga) and Khayelitsha.
