#### Why Go?

Some two million tourists visit the Cayman Islands each year. Most of them are cruise-ship passengers, who spend a few hours shopping, sunbathing or swimming with stingrays, before pulling out of port. Others hunker down near Seven Mile Beach, enjoying their all-inclusive resort on one of the Caribbean's most beautiful stretches of sand. And a lucky few yenture further.

Cayman is an undeniably cosmopolitan place – nearly half the population is from somewhere else – but its rich local culture is alive and well, especially in Bodden Town, East End and Cayman Brac. Explore the North Side and the Sister Islands to discover lush forests, diverse birdlife, mysterious caves and untrammeled beaches. Under the waves lie amazing underwater walls and accessible shipwrecks.

Dive in. It takes only a small sense of adventure to uncover Cayman's greatest treasures – the warm hospitality and the fantastic natural phenomena above and below the sea.

#### When to Go

**Dec-Apr** High season, temperatures average a pleasant 75°F (24°C) and humidity is at its lowest. Accommodations fill up and prices are significantly higher.

**Sep-Oct** Rainfall is highest, with frequent afternoon showers that clear as quickly as they arrive. Some venues close during these months (especially on Little Cayman and Cayman Brac).

**Nov** Pirates Week is a super fun, island-wide event that takes place in early November.
