## Why Go?

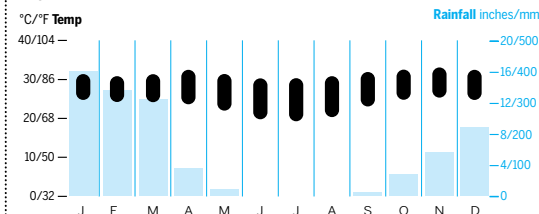

### Darwin



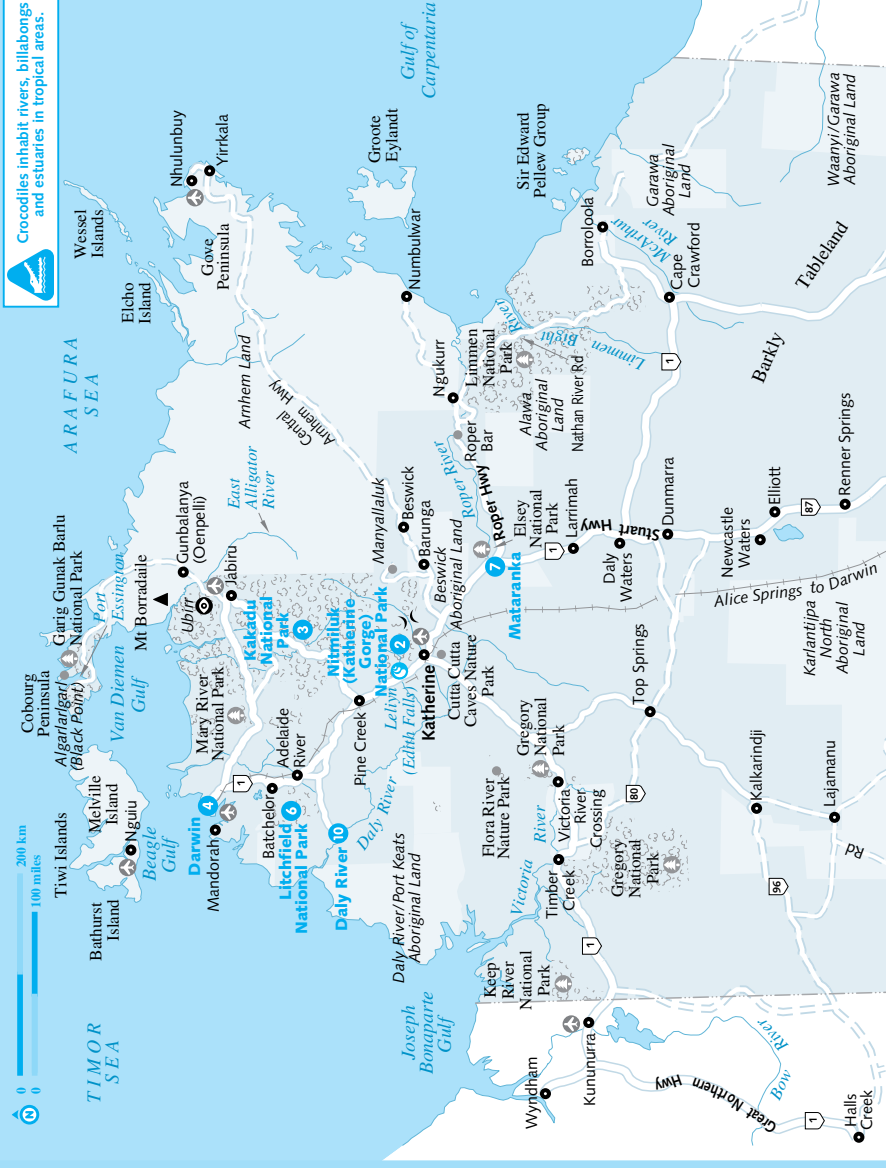
**Apr–Aug** Peak season with lower humidity up north and cooler temperatures in the Red Centre.

**Jun & Jul** Beanie Festival and Camel Cup in Alice, Beer Can Regatta and Fringe Festival in Darwin.

**Sep–Mar** Bar-ramundi fishing heats up as the Wet turns the Top End into a watery wonderland.
