Ancient Rome

From the crumbling Colosseum to the ancient Forum and the Appian Way, few sights are more evocative than the ruins of ancient Rome (p369). Two thousand years ago this city was the centre of the greatest empire of the ancient world, where gladiators battled and emperors lived in unimaginable luxury. Nowadays, it's a haunting spot; as you walk the cobbled paths you can almost sense the ghosts in the air. Below: View of the Colosseum (p375) from the Roman Forum






Eiffel Tower, Paris

Initially designed as a temporary exhibit for the 1889 Exposition Universelle (World Fair), the elegant, art nouveau design of Paris' Eiffel Tower (p183) has become the defining fixture of the skyline. Its recent 1st-floor refit adds two glitzy glass pavilions housing interactive exhibits; outside them, peer d-o-w-n through glass floor to the ground below. Visit at dusk for best day and night views of the glittering City of Light and make a toast at the sparkling champagne bar.

London's Nightlife

World-famous theatres, landmark cinemas, iconic venues, underground clubs – London's at its liveliest after dark, when there's no better time to take the cultural pulse of the UK capital (p88). Catching a musical or a play in the West End is on most people's itinerary, but that's just the beginning of London's nightlife: you could join the groundlings at Shakespeare's Globe Theatre, watch a blockbuster on Leicester Sq, or experience high culture at the Royal Opera House. 
THE PALATINO (PALATINE HILL), ROME

Tuscany

The gently rolling hills of Tuscany (p418), bathed in golden light and dotted with vineyards, sum up Italy's attractions in a nutshell. Battalions of books, postcards and lifestyle TV shows try to do this region justice, but nothing beats a visit. Here, picture-perfect hilltop towns vie with magnificent scenery and some of Italy's best food and wine - so it's hardly surprising that this is a tourist hotspot. Visit in spring or autumn to see it at its calmest.
