And everywhere you go there is the backbone of Florida: visitors. They can find anything here, and often, more than what they expected. Get ready to join their satisfied ranks.








25 Florida's Top Highlights



Walt Disney World® Resort

Tampa Cigar Heritage Festival Tampa's Ybor City has a long history as

Art Basel Miami Beach

Miami's Coconut Grove rings in the New Year with this wacky, freak-alicious, after-Christmas parade, which spoofs current events and local politics (www.kingman gostrut.org).
