Why Go?

Talk about criminally undervisited. Few travelers make it to the southwest: it's remote, its treasures vield themselves only to those who apply the effort and its highlights don't exactly roll off the traveler tongue - and that's exactly the reason to turn right out of Santo Domingo instead of left. The stunning coastline of the Península de Pedernales offers miles of pristine, empty beaches and otherworldly swirls of turquoise sea; there's a soundtrack set to twittering birdsong in the cloud forests of the mountains, and the striking dry desert landscape of cactus stretching all the way to the Haitian border will jar your preconceived Caribbean perceptions to the point of disbelief. Like the astounding Bahía de Las Águilas, a 10km deserted stretch of postcard-perfect beach in the far-flung corner of the southwest, you can have this region all to yourself - a notion long-harnessed but long-forgotten in most other parts of the world.

When to Go

Laguna Oviedo's biodiversity is in full swing in March and April, the best time for nature lovers and ecotourists to witness the area's impressive migratory feast. December to February offers up sunny skies and seemingly endless fiestas on every corner, the busiest time for the DR as a whole, with North American and European holidays in overdrive. But caffeine fiends will want to hold off until June: the first week sees the Polo Organic Coffee Festival percolating inland – yes, the coffee is *that* good.
