## Al Markaziyah p130

The world's largest hand-loomed carpet, the fastest roller coaster, the highest high tea, the tower with the greatest lean, the largest cluster of cultural buildings of the 21st century – Abu Dhabi is not afraid to challenge world records. Welcome to an exciting city where nothing stands still... except perhaps the herons in the capital's protected mangroves.

For those looking to engage with Gulf culture, Abu Dhabi, the capital of the United Arab Emirates (UAE), offers opportunities to understand this desert nation's human and natural heritage through museums, exhibitions and tours. But thankfully Emirati heritage here isn't boxed and mothballed, it is also experienced through strolls around the dhow harbour, haggling in markets and absorbing the atmosphere at *sheesha* (water pipe) cafes and family picnics in the city's many parks.

#### **Getting There & Away**

→ Air Abu Dhabi International Airport is one of the biggest and best airports in the world and the national carrier, Etihad, is a multiple-award-winning airline.

➡ Bus Buses between Abu Dhabi's main bus terminal and Dubai's Al Ghubaiba station leave every 40 minutes (single/return Dh20/40, two hours). Intercity buses connect the capital with most Emirati destinations.

Car Abu Dhabi is approximately two

hours' drive from Dubai. Sheikh Zayed Road (Hwy E11) links the two cities.

→ Taxi A shared/private taxi between Abu Dhabi and Dubai costs around Dh50/250. Al Ghazal (p216) takes advance bookings.

#### **Getting Around**

→ Bus There is a modern, air-con bus network that travels along set routes throughout the day and night. Download a map from Abu Dhabi Bus Services (2800 55555; dot.abudhabi.ae; within Abu Dhabi Dh2) website.

→ **Big Bus Tour** Linking all the major sites in the city and connecting with Yas Island, the double-decker, air-con Big Bus (pl44) provides an informative alternative to the public bus service.

→ Big Bus Shuttle This audio-guided shuttle service (⊇toll free 800 244 287; www. bigbustours.com; ⊙9am-5.30pm) takes in the main points of interest on Yas Island and connects with Masdar City. It intersects with the main Big Bus Tour outside Manarat Al Saadiyat on Saadiyat Island.

➡ Bicycle Funride (p145) cycle-hire stations are scattered about the city.

 → Yas Express This complimentary shuttle bus links all the main attractions and amenities on Yas Island. The Yas Express
(202-496 8110; www.yasisland.ae; ⊙9am-9pm)
also links Yas with Saadiyat Island.

• Water Taxi Traditional water taxis (p156), called *abras*, ply the waters of Khor al Maqta and link to the Eastern Mangroves Hotel & Spa.
