But don't discount exciting Serbia with its fortress cities and famous music festival, Muslim-influenced Bosnia's dramatic countryside and two gorgeous Old Towns, the magnificent scenery of Macedonia and Montenegro, or the sublime beaches of Albania. Travel here is a little rough around the edges compared with destinations further north and west, but few people visit the Balkans without leaving in awe, with their preconceptions smashed.
