
Why Go?

Stretching across Finland's waist from the Gulf of Bothnia to the long Russian border, this broad swath of territory takes in the boffins of Oulu's booming technology sector and the brown bears raising their shaggy heads as they patrol the eastern forests. It offers some of the nation's most memorable outdoor experiences, from birdwatching and beach-combing in the west to skiing, canoeing and trekking in the east.

The further you get from Oulu, the more remote things become. Kainuu is a heavily wooded wilderness and important animal habitat traversed by the famed UKK trekking route. Koillismaa, near the Russian border, is the transitional region between the south and Lapland, and includes Oulanka National Park, one of Finland's natural highlights. It is an area of tumbling rivers, isolated lakes and dense forests. This is perhaps Finland's best destination for getting active in the great outdoors, whether in summer or winter.

History

The region's geography reflects its tar-producing history. In the 19th century the remote Kainuu and Koillismaa areas began producing tar from the numerous pines, and sent it on the precarious journey downriver to Oulu, whence it was shipped to the boatbuilding nations of Europe. The merchants prospered, and Oulu still has a sleek, cosmo-

politan feel compared with the backwoodsy feel of the rest of its province.
