
Why Go?




Easter Easter is marked by solemn processions and colourful passion plays.

- ③ See red, blazing red, between fantastic rock formations in **Les Calanques de Piana** (p888)
- ④ Slip into serene turquoise waters at **Plage de Palombaggia** (p895) and **Plage de Santa Giulia** (p895)
- ⑤ Admire the work of prehistoric people – see where they lived and what they built – at **Filitosa** (p894)
- ⑥ Bone up on Bonaparte around Napoléon's home town, **Ajaccio** (p887)
- ⑦ Ride the rickety **Tramway de la Balagne** (p882) along the coast
- ⑧ Discover island paradise with a boat trip to the **Îles Lavezzi** (p893)
- ⑨ Hike along the **Bonifacio coastal path** (p893) from citadel to lighthouse, with awesome cliff vistas
- ⑩ Test your nerves, fitness and head for heights on **Bonifacio's** (p892) extraordinary 187-step Escalier du Roi d'Aragon down to the sea

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
