

# **Evia & the Sporades**

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#### **Best Places to Stay**


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### Why Go?

Evia (Εύβοια) and the four Sporades islands (Oι Σποράδες) remain largely off the beaten island path, though a busy drawbridge at Halkida joins Evia to the mainland. But away from the commercial hubs of Halkida and nearby Eretria, the pace slows as the landscape stretches out, dotted by hill-top monasteries, small farms, vineyards and not a few curious goats.

The Sporades ('scattered ones') seem like extensions of the forested Pelion Peninsula, and, in fact, they were joined in prehistoric times. Skiathos is easily the most developed of the group, but also claims the sandiest beaches in the Aegean. Low-key Skopelos kicks back with a postcardworthy harbour and forest meadows. Remote Alonnisos anchors the National Marine Park of Alonnisos, protecting the Mediterranean monk seal. Skyros, the southernmost of the chain, is known for its cuisine, woodworking and ceramics, all traditions that date from Byzantine times when these islands were home to rogues and pirates.



Feb & Mar Carnival season keeps things warm with plenty of merrymaking. Apr & May Spring is in the air and Easter festivities linger long into the night. Jun & Sep Perfect temperatures and clear skies – ideal hiking conditions.
