When to Go

Apr, May & Sep Crowds and prices dip before and after summer vacation. Mild and sunny days.

Oct & Nov Moderate number of visitors, with decent prices on airfares and accommodations. Expect increased crowds and business closures around Thanksgiving Day.

Dec-Mar & Jun-Aug Accommodations rates double or triple. In Easter, the area around Hilo is jammed during the Merrie Monarch Festival.
