1 Do as the locals and enjoy an afternoon soak at one of the city's public geothermal pools, such as **Laugardalur** (p53)

2 Don your *lopapeysa*, grab your MacBook and join the legions of accidental hipsters sipping quarts of coffee at one of the city's awesomely quirky **cafes** (p68)

3 Immerse yourself in Icelandic history at the brilliantly curated **Reykjavík 871 +/− 2** (p48) set atop the excavated ruins of a Viking hall

4 Enjoy a performance or simply relax in the comfy lounge chairs at **Harpa** (p48), the capital's sparkling new cultural centre

5 Join the **djammid** (p47), a wild pub crawl through Reykjavík's tiny but oh-so-cool bars and clubs

6 Survey the city from the heights of **Hallgrímskirkja's** (p46) modernist steeple
