

If you've ever been into white sand, azure bays, frothing hot springs and hidden traditional villages, Nusa Tenggara is your wonderland. Here's an arc of islands that is lush and jungle-green in the north, more arid savannah in the south and in-between has some of the world's best diving, limitless surf breaks, and Technicolor volcanic lakes. It's a land of pink-sand beaches, schooling sharks and rays, and swaggering dragons. You'll also find a cultural diversity that is unmatched in Indonesia. Animist rituals and tribal traditions still thrive alongside the countless minarets, temples, convents and chapels, and though Bahasa Indonesia is a unifying tongue, each main island has at least one native language, which is often subdivided into dialects. Whether your wish is to drop into the easy, tourist-ready life of a care-free Gili, or you crave something, somewhere less comfortable, more challenging and a shade deeper, you're exactly where you're supposed to be.

When To Go



Nusa Tenggara Highlights

- 1 Snorkelling or diving in coral reefs teeming with marine life around the **Komodo National Park** (p348) and the **Alor archipelago** (p371)
 - 2 Trekking up the lush slopes of **Gunung Rinjani** (p327), the sacred volcano that dominates northern Lombok
 - 3 Coming face-to-face with the mother of all lizards in **Komodo or Rinca** (p346)
 - 4 Exploring the remote villages of **West Timor** (p374), characterised by their beehive-shaped clan houses, and experiencing the island's unique tribal culture, markets and textiles
 - 5 Gazing at the lunar-like landscape atop **Gunung Kelimutu** (p365), with its three astonishing crater lakes
