It seems like everyone's going 'green' these days, but how can you know which businesses are actually eco-friendly and which are simply jumping on the sustainability bandwagon?

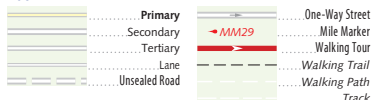
