
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Why Go?

The classic tourist route from Antananarivo (Tana) takes you south along the RN7 through Central Madagascar, a high plateau stretching all the way to Fianarantsoa. You'll twist and turn through these highlands, a region of scenic hills and rice paddies that resists generalisation. Here you'll find a potpourri of traveller's delights: bustling market towns clogged with colourful *pousse-pousse* (rickshaws), a famous railway line, small villages of distinctive two-storey mudbrick homes with porches and thatched roofs, a mountain stronghold of lemurs, the legacy of French colonialism, national parks with landscapes ranging from thick jungle to wide-open grandeur, and some of the best trekking Madagascar has to offer. For many people this is their introduction to the country, and it's a good one, with a variety of attractions linked by a gentle road as well as friendly residents.

When to Go

Antsirabe



Jul–Sep Famadihana ceremonies take place in the Antsirabe area; visitors may be invited to attend.

Apr–May Countryside is greenest following the end of the rainy season.

Sep–Oct Best weather of the year, animals active, lemurs have babies.
