The Wharf is always lively and holds a few surprises. Stick near the waterfront, where sea lions bray, street performers scare unsuspecting passersby, and an aquarium and carousel entice wide-eved kids, Explore tall ships, consult mechanical fortune tellers and eat the obligatory clam chowder in a sourdough-bread bowl. (\$\overline{\overli Powell-Mason, Powell-Hyde, MF)

★ Must see The sea lions at Pier 39. Musée Mécanique, San Francisco Maritime National Historic Park, and the Aquatic Park.

From its 19th-century founding to hold Civil War deserters and Native American dissidents, to its closure by Bobby Kennedy in 1963, Alcatraz was America's most notorious prison. No prisoner is known to have escaped alive. For maximum chill factor, book the spooky twilight jailhouse tour. On the return ferry to San Francisco, freedom never felt so good. ★ Top tip Weather changes fast and it's often much colder on Alcatraz, so wear extra layers.





Head south of the park's border for upscale Mexican at Nopalito (12249th Avenue).

Crowning the northwest corner are Barbary Coast baroque mansions, including watchtowertopped, gilded 1889 Westerfield House, which has survived tenancies by czarist Russian bootleggers, Fillmore jazz musicians and hippie communes. (Hayes & Scott Sts; 5, 21, 22, 24)



Impress a date on the cheap at nearby Rosamunde Sausage Grill (545 Haight St).


