Why Go?


Johor is Malaysia's most populous state and a growing economic power player. Most travel itineraries skip it, but those who stray into the southern gateway to Malaysia will be rewarded with the blissful solitude of its postcard-perfect islands and wild jungles, while getting access to a taste of authentic Malaysian culture and character not easily found in bigger tourist hot spots.

The top draw is without a doubt the ridiculously gorgeous white sand islands of the Seribuat Archipelago, where you'll find world-class diving, lost-beach trails and plenty of relaxation time with a fraction of Tioman's crowds. Inland, Endau-Rompin National Park offers the same rich flora, very elusive fauna (rhinos! elephants!) and swashbuckling action that visitors flock to experience at Taman Negara in Pahang, but can get here in a more pristine setting.

And then there's Johor Bahru, the working-class capital with a handful of worthwhile religious sites and museums that plays sister-city to neighbouring Singapore.

Nov–Feb The monsoon season brings bargain deals, rain and bugs. Surfers head to Rawa for rollers.

Mar–May Visibility in Seribuat's already translucent waters is at its best for diving and snorkelling.

Jun–Jul Pulau Besar closes for Expedition Robinson. Expect high temperatures everywhere.

Johor Bahru

After years of being criticised as a dirty, chaotic border town, Johor's capital city of Johor Bahru (JB for short) has been repaved and replanted and is well on the way to rebranding itself.

Most travellers skip southern Malaysia's largest city, but for the intrepid souls who stop for an afternoon or quick overnighter, there's a handful of worthwhile museums, temples and mosques, shopping and party zones, and a heritage district that offers poetic street scenes, hip galleries and playful cafes.
