## The Most Liveable City?

Melbourne consistently ranks as one of the world's most liveable cities. In 2016, Melbourne basked in the title of the World's Most Liveable City for the sixth year in a row, according to the prestigious *Economist* Intelligence Unit. What makes Melbourne so good?

Melbourne always ranks highly for infrastructure and safety, and although the state hasn't been immune to the global financial crisis, Victoria has consistently recorded growth rates that are the envy of the industrialised world.

The city does have some chinks in its armour. Melbourne weather can be glorious, but it can also be wet, windy and changeable at a moment's notice. The current Labor government is facing tough challenges around the increase in crime and drug problems, which threaten the high-safety ranking, while the ever-increasing number of homeless people are left wondering just how this 'most liveable city' claim can really be true. Then there's the spiralling cost of living. Salaries have largely kept pace, but everything from restaurant meals to hotel rooms have soared in recent years, while home ownership has become an unattainable dream for many. To see what we mean, stop by a real-estate auction and watch the prices skyrocket out of control.

# **Urban & Regional Sprawl**

Urban planning stands at the centre of public debate in Melbourne, not least because Melbourne's population is expected to almost double to 10 million by 2050. All around its outer limits, new suburbs appear, often before transport infrastructure and other essential services are in place. With inner Melbourne already out of reach for many home buyers and renters, these questions grow in importance every year.
