Why Go?


Those gigantic aquamarine waves keep rolling in, as they have forever along Mexico's central Pacific coast. It's the primal rhythm that backs any visit to this land of stunning beaches and giant sunsets.

Or switch into resort mode, margarita in hand and salsa blaring on the poolside sound system, at a world-class luxury hotel.

Central Pacific Coast Highlights

- 1 Take the pulse of the new **Old Mazatlán** (p490) in its gorgeously renovated historic center
- 2 Stroll streets pungent with drying shrimp in **Mexcaltítan** (p496), thought by some to be the Aztecs' ancestral homeland
- 3 People-watch and promenade on the beautiful beachfront *malecón* (oceanfront promenade) in **Puerto Vallarta** (p508)
- 4 Surf the aggressive barrel swells in **Boca de Pascuales** (p531)
- 5 Thrill at the fearless finesse of **La Quebrada Clavadistas** (cliff divers, p552) in Acapulco
- 6 Soak up the mellow party vibe along the surfer-happy sands and the cafe-encircled plaza in **Sayulita** (p505)
- 7 Shop for ingredients you've never heard of and learn to make the perfect *chile relleno* (chili stuffed with meat or cheese) at a cooking class in **Zihuatanejo** (p545)
- 8 Watch sunrise over the lagoon and sunset over the Pacific in **Pie de la Cuesta** (p549)
