### Why Go?


Rewarding doesn't begin to cover Iran as a destination. This exceptionally welcoming country has a multifaceted history and rich, artistic culture manifested in myriad ways. Hospitality is a way of life here and chatting with locals over tea or a meal will likely provide your most memorable moments.

Stunning mosques, palaces and ruins from different eras provide architectural wonder, while the shopping culture of the brilliant bazaars adds a colour beyond description. The outdoors, too, is captivating, with baking deserts and soaring mountain ranges providing a spectacular backdrop wherever you gaze.

Good, cheap transport makes getting around easy and Iran is also very safe for travellers. Though Iranian citizens are often subject to government repression, culturally sensitive and respectful foreigners are unlikely to encounter problems. A sprawling metropolis and one of the world's 20 largest cities, Tehran is the beating heart of the nation. Iran's capital has a lovely natural setting, sloping down from the Alborz Mountains, through the boutiques and liberal atmosphere of the wealthy north to the poorer, lively south, Rapid growth has come at a cost: terrible traffic and constant pollution mean it's far from relaxing. Still, Tehran's immense cultural vitality, not to mention the impressive museums and galleries it's packed with, make it an intriguing place to visit.

#### History

Tehran wasn't particularly significant until it became the 19th-century centre of Qajar Persia and steadily expanded. By 1900 it had grown to 250,000 people, and in the 20th century it became one of the most populous cities on earth.



#### Central & Southern Tehran

**Tehran Bazar** 

بازار تهران); Map p142; main entrance 15 Khordad -e Khordad) FREE This maze of bustling alleys makes for fascinating exploration. The warren of people and goods is a city within a city and includes guesthouses, restaurants and mosques. Most lanes specialise in a particular commodity: copper, paper, gold, spices and carpets, among others.

#### **Golestan Palace**

PAI ACE (کاخ گلستان; Map p142; www.golestanpalace.ir; Arg Sq; admission US\$4.50, plus per sight US\$1.50; ⊕ 9am-4.30pm Sun-Fri: M Panzdah-e Khordad) This monument to the glories and excesses of the Qajar rulers is made up of several grand buildings set around a carefully manicured garden. Separate tickets cover each.

The Negar Khane (Art Gallery) displays a collection of Qajar-era paintings. Portraits of the shahs show dashing figures with catwalk poses and jewelled scabbards. The palace's centrepiece is the small but dazzling Talar-e-Aineh (Hall of Mirrors) and its enormous adjoining halls, with fine plaster moulding, mirrorwork, and gifts from European royals.
