NorCal in a Nutshell

Before you let your mind wander to suntanned, traffic-jammed, bikiniclad visions of California, remember that NorCal bears little cultural resemblance to Orange County. Although nobody can agree on exactly where to draw the dividing line, there's something that happens along the drive through the Central Valley, a salt-of-the-earth place that filters out much of the cultural static. The interest in Hollywood is replaced by one in redwood. The relationship to technology is as essential as the relationship to nature. There's always some kind of protest going on.

Medical marijuana is old news – the state allowed its use back in 1996 – but the myriad social and economic effects of the marijuana industry is a hot topic, particularly along the North Coast, where it grows like, um, weeds. The federal government, which had previously turned a blind eye to the gray area of medical marijuana, began to crack down on large for-profit growers in Northern California in fall 2011.

Since the 1960s, Northern California has relished political demonstrations. In 2011, several thousand protesters associated with the 'Occupy Wall St' movement grabbed national headlines by closing the Port of Oakland, America's fifth largest port.

Roots of Environmentalism

Californians originally helped kick-start the world's conservation movement in the midst of the 19th-century industrial revolution, creating laws curbing industrial dumping, setting aside swaths of prime real estate as urban green space, and protecting pristine wilderness in national and state parks. It's no surprise that Northern Californians lead the nation by choosing sustainable food and low-impact lifestyles, preserving old-growth forests, declaring nuclear-free zones, pushing for environmentally
