Norway Today

Crisis? What Crisis?

Ask most Norwegians how their country has weathered the global financial crisis and you're likely to be met with a guilty smile. Yes, growth rates stalled as world oil prices fell and the economy even contracted in 2009. And yet, the impact upon ordinary Norwegians has been minimal – unemployment in 2009 was just 3.2%, prices rose in the same period by an eminently reasonable 2.1% and the government's generous system of social welfare and other benefits remained intact. As a consequence, the average Norwegian has largely been insulated from the world's worst economic crisis in decades.

Independent & Apart

With such stability and prosperity at home, it's Norway's relationship with the rest of the world that dominates many public debates. For one thing, Norway continues to agonise over whether it should join the European Union (EU). Government-supported referenda on membership in 1972 and again in 1994 were narrowly defeated. And Norway looks increasingly likely to remain on the outside of the EU looking in. After a near 50-50 split for many years, opinion has hardened against membership – a series of opinion polls in mid-2010 found that just 25% of Norwegians favoured membership, with around two-thirds opposed. For now, the resistance to anyone else telling Norwegians how to live their lives – fostered during centuries of foreign occupation – seems to be winning the day.

Struggle for the Soul of Norway

When it comes to its hard-won national identity, Norway stands at something of a crossroads. Centuries of hardship forged a strong sense of selfreliance, while the fabulous oil wealth of the late 20th century nurtured
