The Philippines Today

A New Era?

The first decade of the 21st century was a tumultuous one in Philippine politics. It began with an impeachment trial that saw millions of Filipinos take to the streets to oust President Joseph Estrada over corruption allegations – the country's second 'People Power' revolution in 15 years. Estrada gave way to his vice president, Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo, whose nearly 10 years in office were also dogged by scandals, including one concerning alleged improprieties in her 2004 re-election.

As we went to press, Arroyo had just been arrested on charges that she tampered with the results of subsequent congressional elections in 2007.

In the 2010 presidential elections, the country found the fresh face it was looking for in the form of Benigno Aquino III, the squeaky-clean son of Corazon Aquino, hero of the first People Power revolution in 1986. Riding a wave of national grief after his mother's death in 2009, Aquino emerged from a pack of candidates and won in a landslide victory.

The early returns on Aquino's first six-year term have been positive. Analysts have lauded his willingness to tackle corruption and interest groups. But two crucial issues promise to test Aquino's political will: the 'Maguindanao Massacre' trial, and the Reproductive Health Bill.

The Maguindanao Massacres & the Media

It was the election-related crime that shocked the world: in the run-up to the 2010 gubernatorial elections in Maguindanao, Mindanao, 58 people were gunned down at a campaign event for an opposition candidate. Thirty-four of the victims were members of the media.

The alleged perpetrators were associated with the region's dominant Ampatuan clan, led by patriarch and incumbent governor (at the time)

- President
 Benigno Aquino is the son of 11th president
 Corazon Aquino
- » The previous (14th) president, Gloria Arroyo, is the daughter of 9th president Diosdado Macapagal
- » 12th President Fidel Ramos is Ferdinand Marcos' second cousin

Faux Pas
