Welcome to Copenhagen

Compact Copenhagen is the epitome of Scandi cool. Modernist lamps light New Nordic tables, bridges buzz with cycling commuters, and eye-candy locals dive into pristine waterways. Despite the cobbled streets, whimsical spires and palaces, this is a city at the very cutting edge, bursting at the seams with boundary-pushing food, design and fashion. Go on, take a bite of the (sustainable) good life.



Tivoli Gardens (p24)

Denmark's number one tourist attraction is also the world's second-oldest amusement park. Slip into a whimsical whirl of story book pavilions, squealinducing rides, live music and late-night fireworks, right in the heart of the city.





Nationalmuseet (p28)

Relive millennia of Danish history at the engrossing National Museum. This is Denmark's communal attic, jampacked with prehistoric finds, glittering Viking treasures, astoundingly preserved bodies and retro-fab collectables



Christiansborg Slot (p36)

Seat of the Danish parliament, big, bold Christiansborg Slot is the epicentre of Danish power. It's also a fascinating jumble of history and culture, home to remarkable tapestries, regal carriages, theatre costumes and ancient ruins.



Designmuseum Danmark (p60)

Drool and swoon at Copenhagen's temple to beautiful design. From Kaare Klint and Hans Wegner to Verner Panton and Arne Jacobsen, the Design Museum's collection is a who's who of visionary Danish style makers.

10 Top Sights

Louisiana (p120)

More than just one of Europe's great modern art museums, Louisiana is a soul-stirring experience. Perched by the blue waters of the Øresund, it's a soothing oasis where modernist architecture meets playful garden sculptures and inspiring cultural events.





Rosenborg Slot (p84)

Ravishing Rosenborg is home to Denmark's dazzling crown jewels, not to mention room after creaky room of regal artefacts, from precious tapestries, timepieces and porcelain to King Christian IV's very own toilet.

Statens Museum for Kunst (p88)

Copenhagen's National Gallery serves up seven centuries of creativity, including works by Rembrandt, Rubens, Matisse and Munch, not to mention the world's greatest collection of Danish brushstrokes.





Christiania (p72)

Let your hair down in Europe's most famous commune, a pot-scented microuniverse of DIY abodes and studios, rambling garden paths and free spirits downing beer in the shadow of crumbling barracks.



Insider tips to help you find the real city

Beyond Copenhagen's celebrated museums, landmarks and waterfront is the city the locals live and love – a multifaceted place of Nordic market produce, whimsical street art, grit-hip bars and tranquil, romantic gardens.

Torvehallerne KBH (p90)

- ▶ Gourmet bites
- ► Artisan produce

Copenhagen's twin-hall food market is a culinary Valhalla, lined with just-plucked Nordic herbs and vegetables, icy seafood, robust meats and cheeses, and local spirits. Stock the pantry or cut straight to the chase and feast on-site at stalls peddling everything from spiced oats, smørrebrød (open sandwiches) and handmade pasta to craft beers and Third Wave coffee.

Østerbro (p104)

- Heritage architectureCosy cafes and eateries
- More than just a neighbourhood of yummy mummies and yoga mats,

posh Østerbro rewards the curious with brightly coloured town houses and story book quarters. There are quiet squares pimped with comfy cafes, and the city's most beautiful, and historic, swimming pool.

Frederiksberg (p118)

- ► Subterranean art

Blue-ribbon, bourgeois Frederiksberg delivers an eclectic neighbourhood encounter. It's a place where elegant parks and cosy bistros rub shoulders with fanciful brewery architecture, a zoo and a cistern turned art space.
