Welcome to Stockholm

Sweden's stylish capital is an accessible beauty, easy to navigate and gorgeous from all angles. Its old town, Gamla Stan, is a saffron-and-spice vision from the history books, while the modern city centre rewards cool-hunters and food fanatics alike. Outside of town, royal palaces loom over lakes, and tiny red cottages decorate windswept islands.

Skansen (p52)

Known as 'Sweden in miniature', Skansen is an open-air museum and park that serves as Stockholm's communal playground. It's home to a Nordic zoo, historic buildings, a glassblowers' hut, live-music performances and lots more.





Vasamuseet (p56)

This wildly popular museum was purpose-built to tell the story of the short maiden voyage and long restoration of the massive warship *Vasa*, which sank to the bottom of the sea within minutes of setting sail.



Kungliga Slottet

Stockholm's imposing royal palace – the world's largest still used for its original purpose – houses some beautiful examples of Swedish baroque and rococo interiors. Guided tours make Swedish history entertaining.



Stockholm Archipelago (p120)

A scenic boat ride among the thousands of rocky islands in the Stockholm archipelago is one of the loveliest ways to relax on a summer day. Have some extra time? Kick it up a notch and stay overnight!

10 Top Sights

Drottningholm (p108)

The excellent guided tours of the Renaissance-inspired summer palace bring generations of Swedish royals vividly to life, and the parklike setting couldn't be prettier. In summer, go by boat to get the full impact of the place.



Millesgården (p96)

The former home and studio of beloved sculptor Carl Milles is a work of art in its own right, with its elaborate Italianate house, modern gallery and beautiful outdoor sculpture garden.



Historiska Museet (p84)

An utterly engrossing place, this museum spans 10,000 years of Swedish history, using artifacts and multimedia installations to re-create the Viking era, show off pillaged treasure and illustrate medieval battles.

Moderna Museet (p58)

With its world-class collection housed in a fabulous building, Moderna is a must-see for art fans. It also has a stellar bookshop, an acclaimed restaurant and consistently well-executed temporary exhibits.

Fotografiska (p70)

An impressive and stylish hall of photography, Fotografiska never fails to present thorough, high-calibre exhibitions, usually several at a time. The location is cool, and there's a top-notch cafe-har



Stadshuset (p100)

This imposing building defines the Stockholm skyline, with its blocky silhouette and waterside perch. Inside is the glittering Golden Hall, frescoes by Prins Eugen and the inspiring Nobel Prize banquet room.



Insider tips to help you find the real city

Once you've checked off the must-see sights on your list, it's time to find out what Stockholm is like for locals. Be warned: there will be shopping.

Norrmalm Shopping (p38)

- ▶ High-fashion boutiques
- ▶ Beautiful architecture
 Whether you're after
 traditional handmade
 Swedish crafts, fine crystal, outdoors equipment
 or the most exclusive
 high-fashion brands,
 you'll find it in Norrmalm's glittering shops.

Escaping to Djurgården (p60)

- ▶ Quiet paths

Though it's only a short stroll across a bridge from the heart of the city, Djurgården feels like a quiet, green oasis. The parklike island is mostly undeveloped woodlands, laced with fields and trails

where fitness-savvy locals go to run or just relax.

Södermalm Bar-Hopping (p72)

- ▶ Bars full of character▶ Characters in the bars
- Hard to beat for atmosphere and peoplewatching alike, Södermalm is known as the arty-funky neighbourhood for good reason. Ranging from ultra-chic cocktail bars to antique Swedish beer halls to basement dives, the bars and pubs here reward intrepid exploration.

Opulent Östermalm (p86)

- ► Culinary delights
- ► Elegant buildings and boulevards

Live large in this upmarket yet non-stodgy neighbourhood: do some window-shopping, splash out on a decadent meal or a fancy cocktail, pick up some designer fashion, or just wander down a street lined with gorgeous old buildings and feel like a million bucks.
