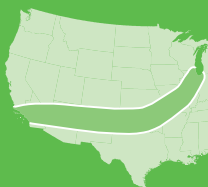
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Road Trips

Eastern Route 66 (p50)

Start your nostalgic, kitschy adventure in downtown Chicago, before making your way through Illinois, Missouri, 13 miles of Kansas, and Oklahoma.

Central Route 66 (p70)

From Bryce Canyon to Wheeler Peak, eye-catching natural sites abound in the Southwest. And while these landmarks are stunning, it's often the journey between them that provides the memories.

Western Route 66 (p100)

Starting in hot, hot Needles on the Arizona border, speed through eerie ghost towns beside railroad tracks in the Mojave Desert, on to the waving palm trees and carnival pier of Santa Monica.

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
