Explore Golden Gate Park & the Avenues

Civilization is overrated, with its traffic jams and office blocks – but once you reach the Conservatory of Flowers in Golden Gate Park, that's all behind you. Hang out with blue butterflies in the rainforest dome at the California Academy of Sciences, or globe-trot from Oceanic masks to James Turrell light installations in the worldly arts exhibits of the de Young Museum. Enjoy a moment of Zen and green tea in the Japanese Tea Garden, then summit Strawberry Hill for views past Stow Lake to the Pacific as red-tailed hawks swoop past.

Wander to San Francisco Botanical Garden for respite in the redwood grove before hopping the N streetcar all the way to Ocean Beach. Stroll the 4-mile stretch of sand to the Richmond for dinner at Aziza and tequila school at Tommy's Mexican Restaurant, or stay put in the Sunset for surf-shopping at Mollusk and dinner at Outerlands. With food and fog like this, you must be in heaven.

Local Life

➔ **Foggy days** Stay warm with Trouble Coffee (p207), hoodies from Mollusk (p209), matinees at Balboa Theatre (p208), and rainforest strolls inside the California Academy of Sciences (p200) and Conservatory of Flowers (p201).

➔ **Goose bumps, guaranteed** Get delicious chills with bare feet on Ocean Beach (p203), eerily lifelike ceremonial masks at de Young Museum (p200), cliff's-edge views along the Coastal Trail (p202) and ice-cream cocktails at Trad'r Sam (p207).

➔ **Out-there art outposts** Outlandishness is a way of life at Park Life (p209) art openings, Frankenart Mart (p203) DIY art installations, and immersive We Players theater productions at Sutro Baths (p202).

Getting There & Away

➔ **Bus** Numbers 1, 31 and 38 run from downtown through the Richmond, while 7 and 6 head from downtown to the Sunset. Buses 5 and 21 skirt the north edge of Golden Gate Park, while north-south buses 28, 29 and 44 cut across the park. Bus 2 covers Clement St, 33 connects to the Haight and Castro, and 18 spans the Great Hwy.

➔ **Streetcar** The N line runs from downtown through the Sunset to Ocean Beach.
