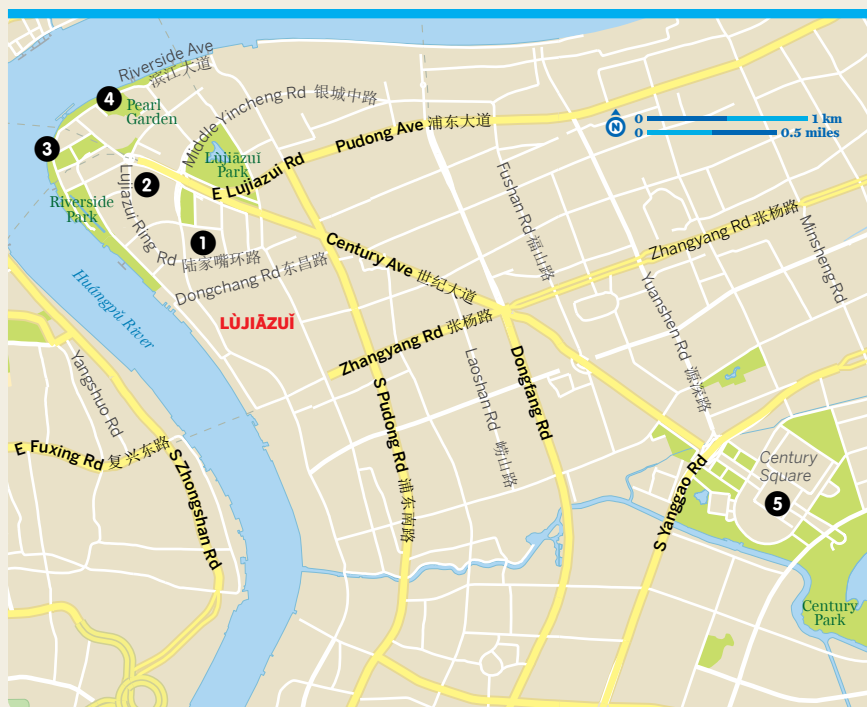


Pūdōng

Neighbourhood Top Five

- 1 Oriental Pearl TV Tower** (p146) Viewing Shànghǎi from low-orbit altitude through the glass-floored walkway.
- 2 Flair** (p154) Sinking an evening alfresco cocktail and bathing yourself in Pūdōng's neon glow.
- 3 Aurora Museum** (p148) Getting a culture hit admiring ancient jade and porcelain treasures.
- 4 Riverside Promenade** (p149) Taking a stroll and aiming your camera westwards as the sun sets over Pūxī.
- 5 Shànghǎi History Museum** (p148) Leafing through the colourful pages of the city's history.

Lonely Planet's Top Tip

The best time to see Lùjiāzuī's modern architecture is during late afternoon or at twilight/early evening, especially during summer (the wide Pūdōng roads make the sun merciless). Sky-high views from observation decks, bars and restaurants allow you to contrast day, dusk and evening views. Walk around the elevated walkway by the Oriental Pearl TV Tower for show-stopping evening visuals.

Explore: Pūdōng

With its neck-craning tourists, scurrying suits and dazzling evening neonscapes, Pūdōng is a place name many Westerners know before setting foot in China. More than 1.5 times bigger than urban Shànghǎi, the economic powerhouse of the Pūdōng New Area (浦东新区; Pūdōng Xīnqū) swallows up the eastern bank of the Huángpǔ River.

The high-rise area directly across from the Bund is the Lùjiāzuī Finance and Trade Zone, where China's largest stock market (the Shànghǎi Stock Exchange) makes or breaks China's nouveau riche. There's no obvious focal point where people congregate, although a swirlpool of sightseers rotates around the elevated walkway by the Oriental Pearl TV Tower.

Opened in mid-2016, the Shànghǎi Disney Resort in Pūdōng is already sucking in legions of thrill-seeking tots and young-at-heart.

Local Life

➤ **Shop** Flee the slick malls and make a beeline to the AP Xinyáng Fashion & Gifts Market (p155) to haggle among local shoppers.

➤ **Take a ferry** Hop aboard the ferry across the Huángpǔ River with a scrum of Shànghǎi workers (and take your bike with you).

Getting There & Away

➤ **Metro** Line 2 powers through Lùjiāzuī, Century Ave and the Science & Technology Museum. Line 9 cuts through the southern part of the French Concession and on to Century Ave. Lines 4 and 6 also slice through Pūdōng, all four lines converging at Century Ave. Other connections include metro lines 7, 8, 11 and the Maglev train.

➤ **Ferry** Runs regularly between Pūxī and Pūdōng for the six-minute trip across the river (¥2). It's a 10-minute walk to the Jīnmào Tower from the dock.

➤ **Bus** Both City Sightseeing Buses (p261) and Big Bus Tours (p261) have lines to Lùjiāzuī from Pūxī.

➤ **Taxi** A taxi ride from the Bund will cost you around ¥30, as you'll have to pay the ¥15 tunnel toll heading eastwards.

➤ **Bund Sightseeing Tunnel** Travel underneath the Huángpǔ River in a tunnel dedicated to kitsch.
