
Why Go?

If you want to experience Australia's astoundingly large outback, wheeling into the Flinders Ranges in South Australia is a great way to start.

Approaching the Flinders Ranges from the south, the wheat fields and wineries of SA's midnorth district give way to arid cattle stations beneath ochre-coloured peaks. This is ancient country, imbued with the Dreaming stories of the Adnyamathanha people. Emus wander across roads; yellow-footed rock wallabies bound from boulder to boulder.

Trucking further north on the Stuart Hwy, the *real* desert shows its face: a sun-ravaged visage of red sand, spinifex and bullet-straight ribbons of tarmac, running for hundreds of kilometres between quirky outposts of civilisation like Coober Pedy, Woomera and Marree. And if the highway is still too 'city' for your tastes, the legendary Oodnadatta, Birdsville and Strzelecki Tracks stir up plenty of desert dirt.

When to Go



Apr-May Sunbaked desert colours shimmer as things cool at the end of autumn. **Jun-Aug** Winter is peak season here: mild temperatures, clear skies.

Sep-Oct Native wildflowers bloom in the Flinders. Last chance to hit the outback before 35-degree days.
