# Why Go?


Malawi has been previously overlooked as a mere snack at the table of epic safari destinations. That is until Majete Wildlife Reserve, debilitated by underfunding and poaching, was thoroughly restocked and a lion reintroduction program began in 2012. The country now has its Big Five again and travel editors are salivating with excitement. Add to this some new world-class boutique hotels and luxury safari lodges, and you can see why Malawi may just be Africa's next big destination.

Unforgettable landscapes also await. Slicing through the landscape in a trough formed by the Great Rift Valley is Lake Malawi – Africa's third largest – a glittering vision swarming with colourful cichlid fish, and ideal for diving, snorkelling, kayaking or chilling on its desert islands.

Suspended in the clouds in the deep south are the dramatic peaks of Mt Mulanje and Zomba Plateau; both a trekker's dream with mist-cowled forests. Head further north and you'll witness the otherworldly beauty of Nyika Plateau, its grasslands reminiscent of the Scottish Highlands.
