### Why Go?

In the iconic region southwest of Amsterdam, tulips, windmills, cheese, Dutch Masters and blue-and-white Delftware china abound, but it's the cities here that are the biggest draws.

The country's second-largest, Rotterdam, is riding a wave of urban development, redevelopment and regeneration with striking additions to its dramatic skyline, and electrifying art, food and bar scenes that are fuelling an international buzz. Leiden has a centuries-old university culture, historic canal-laced core and exceptional museums. Den Haag, the seat of government and the Dutch royals, as well as the capital of Zuid-Holland (South Holland), also has a trove of magnificent museums, along with a stately air, luxe shopping and resort beach, while Vermeer's beautiful home town Delft is an exquisite medieval time capsule.

Zeeland (Sea Land), the country's southernmost, dykeprotected province, is anchored by the mast-filled port of Middelburg. Cycling throughout this gentle, mostly sub-sealevel region is unparalleled.

#### When to Go

- → Rotterdam's museums, shopping, restaurants, bars and nightlife – as well as its excellent public-transport network – mean you can ignore the weather while indoors, and comfortably visit year-round.
- Spring brings an explosion of colour to the glorious tulipfilled gardens at Keukenhof (p187), which open just eight weeks a year and are worth scheduling a trip around.
- → Between spring and autumn, you'll find many more attractions open throughout the region than in the winter months, and greater odds of enjoying a balmy canal stroll or a beach swim.
