





Great Lakes & Great Plains

The domain of haunting loon calls and howling wolves, shaggy bison and sweeping prairie vistas, the Great Lakes and Great Plains may surprise you with their wildness.

'Great' is the operative word here: the lakes themselves are so huge they seem like boundless inland seas. Carved out by glaciers and then filled with melting snow and ice, today they contain an astounding 20% of the world's fresh water. Get a sense of perspective on Lake Superior's largest island, Isle Royale, or prepare for the canoe trip of a lifetime in Voyageurs, a watery expanse of lakes, rivers and marshes, covering 340 sq miles along the Canadian border.

Farther west are the prairies of the Dakotas; rolling grasslands and striated, eroding buttes make up a quintessentially American landscape.
