## TRANSPORT

Flights, tours and rail tickets can be booked online at www.lonelyplanet.com/travel_ services.

## AIR

Direct flights to/from major destinations within Italy, Europe and the US are available at Marco Polo airport (VCE; © 041260 9260; www.venice airport.it), including budget flights run by UKbased EasyJet and Alitalia's Air One. Most direct flights into Venice come from Rome and Milan, with a handful from Naples, Olbia and Palermo. Ryanair's budget flights to/from London Stansted, Dublin, Shannon, and Paris currently use Treviso's San Giuseppe airport (TSF; © 04223151 11; www.trevisoairportit), a 30km, onehour drive from Venice.

Low-cost airlines are a benefit to travellers, but a burden on the environment and Venice's air quality; to travel with a cleaner conscience, consider a carbon-offset program (see p259). Travel within Northern Italy or from Lugano is often cheaper and more convenient by train (p263), and you'll be cutting back on carbon emissions.

## Airlines

More than 40 airlines serve more than 60 destinations direct to/from Venice. Airlines don't bother with shopfront offices in Venice so you'll have to go online, call the following numbers or try a travel agent:

## Airports

Venice's Marco Polo airport (VCE; © 0412609260 ;www .veniceairport.it) is 12 km outside Venice and just east of Mestre. Arrivi (arrivals) at Marco Polo airport is on the ground floor, where you will also find an Azienda di Promozione Turistica (APT) office, car-hire outlets (p262), hotelbooking agencies, bureaux de change, deposito bagagli (left luggage) and bagagli smarriti (lost luggage).

Check-in and departures are on the 1st floor. You'll find banks, ATMs, cafes and shops on both floors. For transit options into Venice, see below.

Some low-cost airlines, including Ryanair, provide service to Treviso's minuscule San Giuseppe airport (TSF; © 04223151 11; www.tre visoairport.it), about 5 km southwest of Treviso
and about an hour's drive through traffic to Venice. The arrivals hall has a thinly stocked regional tourist information booth, a lost-luggage office, a bureau de change and several car-hire outlets. Next door, in departures, you'll find an ATM and a couple of tour and airline offices (including Ryanair). Eurobus buses (run by ATVO) connect Piazzale Roma with Treviso's San Giuseppe airport (one way/return $€ 5 / 9$, one hour five minutes). Taxis ( $€ 75$ ) can take over an hour in traffic.

## BICYCLE

Not that it's feasible with all those footbridges, but cycling is banned in central Venice. On the larger islands of Lido and Pellestrina, cycling is a pleasant way to get around and reach distant beaches. Bicycle hire places are clustered around the Lido vaporetto stop (Map p116), including Lido on Bike (© 04152680 19; www.lidoonbike.it; Gran Viale 21/ B; single/tandem/double/family bikes per hr $€ 3 / 6-18 / 7 / 14$, single/tandem bikes per day $€ 9 / 18$; 9am-7pm daily, weather permitting).

## GETTING TO/FROM MARCO POLO AIRPORT

To get to Venice from Marco Polo airport, you have four main options: bus, ferry, water taxi and auto taxi. Bear in mind that if you're taking a ferry or water taxi, it's a 10-minute walk down the sidewalk to the airport docks from the arrivals hall. If you take a taxi or bus, you may have to hop on a ferry or walk from the Piazzale Roma depot to reach your hotel in San Marco, Dorsoduro, Castello, Giudecca or the Lido.

## Boat

Scenic and convenient, Alilaguna ( 0412401701 ; www.alilaguna.com) offers 60 - to 80-minute ferry rides ( $€ 13$ ) from the Marco Polo docks into Venice: the A (arancia, or orange) line to Guglie (near the train station) and Rialto; the B (blue) line, with stops at Fondamente Nuove, Lido, San Marco, Zattere, and Giudecca; and the R (red) line to Murano, Lido, Arsenale, San Marco and Zattere. The faster, direct Gold Line to/from San Zaccaria, near San Marco, takes 35 minutes, costs $€ 25$ ( 35 minutes, seven times daily every half hour). Tickets for Alilaguna ferries to Venice can be purchased at the ticket booth in the Marco Polo arrivals hall.

A convenient but expensive option you'll find at the airport docks are water taxis, which can often drop you off right at the water gate of your hotel. Motoschafi Venezia water taxi ( © 0415222303 ) is a collective that offers service between Marco Polo airport and Venice for $€ 90$ to $€ 100$ (possibly more with baggage) for up to four people; ask your $B \& B$ or hotel concierge to pair you with fellow arrivals/departures to share the ride.

## Bus

This is the cheapest way to go.
ATV0 ( 041383672 ; www.atvo.it) buses, known as fly buses, between the airport and Piazzale Roma leave about every half hour ( $\in 3,20$ minutes). Bus stations are in front of the Marco Polo arrivals hall, with ticket machines on the sidewalk. A separate service runs to/from Mestre train station ( $£ 2.50$ ).

ACTV ( © 0412424 ; www.actv.it) bus 5 runs between Marco Polo airport and Piazzale Roma ( $€ 1.50,30$ minutes).

## Taxi

As a back-up option, Auto taxis ( $\mathbf{0} 0415952080$ ) cost around $€ 40$ from Marco Polo airport to Piazzale Roma (15 to 30 minutes).
